## Calculations

This indicator is calculated by dividing the number of respondents who answered "yes, definitely" by the number of respondents who answered "no, yes, somewhat or yes, definitely" to the question: In the last 2 months, did you feel that home support workers have taken your health and safety seriously during the COVID-19 pandemic?

## Notes

The 2021 edition of the Home Care Survey was conducted during the COVID-19 pandemic. While the pandemic did not influence the survey's response rate, users are advised to use the survey data with caution, especially when creating estimates for small sub-populations or when comparing it to other editions of the survey.
