## **Calculations**

This indicator is calculated by dividing the number of respondents who answered "very easy" by the number of respondents who answered "very difficult, somewhat difficult, somewhat easy, very easy" to the question: How easy or difficult is it to call your home support worker or the agency to get help, information or advice?

## **Notes**

The 2021 edition of the Home Care Survey was conducted during the COVID-19 pandemic. While the pandemic did not influence the survey's response rate, users are advised to use the survey data with caution, especially when creating estimates for small sub-populations or when comparing it to other editions of the survey.
